

ENVIRONMENTAL MITIGATION & CONSULTATION REPORT SUMMARY

The current federal transportation legislation contains a requirement that the LRTP include "a discussion of types of potential environmental mitigation activities and potential areas to carry out these activities, including activities that may have the greatest potential to restore and maintain the environmental functions affected by the metropolitan transportation plan. ...This discussion shall be developed in consultation with Federal, State and Tribal land management, wildlife, and regulatory agencies." A three-step process was used to help address this SAFETEA-LU requirement:

- Define and inventory the environmentally sensitive species and resources
- Identify and assess likely impacts on these species and areas from transportation projects
- Address possible mitigation at the system-wide level through consultation with other agencies.

Environmental Mitigation Process

While preparing this environmental report for the LRTP, staff is in the process of consulting with agencies that are responsible for environmental protection, historical preservation, natural resource management, transportation services, economic development, human services, and land use planning. Staff is working with these agencies to obtain their input regarding this environmental report. See Appendix B for a list of agencies that were contacted for this section. Through these consultation efforts, staff hopes to take into account potential system-wide environmental impacts of transportation improvements and how such impacts, if they affect environmentally sensitive areas, might be mitigated.

Consultation

The process that staff used for consultation was based on the recommendations of the Federal Highway Administration. The consultation process had some similarities to the environmental mitigation notification process and because of that, some crossover was used between the two processes. The Public Participation List that the Genesee County Metropolitan Planning Commission (GCMPC) uses for transportation planning outreach was used as a starting point for the consultation process. The participation list encompasses many of the types of agencies and contacts targeted in the environmental mitigation process.

For those agencies targeted strictly for consultation, a process of notification and information was chosen. A letter explaining the consultation process was provided to those agencies in the participation list that fit the criteria set forth in SAFETEA-LU. An explanation of the long range transportation planning process along with information about how that process is utilized in the Flint/Genesee County Metropolitan Area and the role of the Genesee County Metropolitan Alliance was included in the mailing. Finally, a listing of the proposed 2035 Long Range Transportation Plan projects was also provided along with directions on how to provide input on the planning process, how to submit comments on the project list and how to contact GCMPC staff if direct interaction was preferred. Those agencies targeted through the Environmental Mitigation process received the full environmental narrative including a web link to the maps that highlighted potentially affected environmentally sensitive areas. The responses received from the environmental mitigation & consultation letters are included in Appendix B. The listing of the specific agencies that were included in the outreach performed by staff is included in Appendix B as well.
