IX. Committee Reports

A. Nominating Committee Report

John Gilbert stated that the nominated officer for Chair is Robert Johnson. Mr. Gilbert asked if there were any other nominations from the floor. No one spoke at this time. X. Old Business

A. FY 2020-2023 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) Draft Prioritized List of Projects

Sharon Gregory stated that at the last Transportation System Management Subcommittee (TSM) meeting on March 5th the committee approved the assignment of years to go with the projects. Staff will now continue the analysis for Environmental Justice (EJ) and Air Quality on the projects. Staff will schedule the public input sessions for April and then the 30-day comment period in May. Staff is looking to bring the final approval for the TIP projects and the TIP document through TAC and this committee in June.

B. 2018 PASER Data Availability

Jacob Maurer stated that last fall staff released the 2018 PASER Federal Aid network maps during the TIP Call for Projects and just recently staff included the local road network on these maps. Mr. Maurer stated that he would meet with local agencies after the meeting if they would like a copy of their map or they could call him and he would get a copy in the mail to them.

XI. New Business

*****A. Election of Officers**

John Gilbert stated that since there were no more nominations from the floor the Nominating Committee suggests this committee elect the slate of officers as presented by acclimation in the positions they were nominated: Chair, Robert Johnson; Vice-Chair, Robert Plumb; Treasurer, Tod Sorensen; Trustee, Bill Bain; Trustee, Jenifer Almasy; and Trustee, Cheryl Wougther.

Motion: Action: Approve, **moved by** Paulette Johnson, **supported by** David Cain, to approve the Nominating Committee's Slate of Officers and Trustees by acclimation.

Motion carried unanimously.

*****B. FY 2017-2020 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) Amendment #16**

Sharon Gregory stated that most of these are MDOT projects. This amendment meets the financial constraints of the TIP and will have no disproportionately high or adverse impacts to any of the identified Environmental Justice (EJ) populations in Genesee County. The projects that are being amended are eligible for the funding programmed, and they meet the intended state (including State TEDF Category C funds) and federal goals and objectives identified for the funding. Staff has reviewed the projects for Air Quality Conformity Analysis and has determined that they are all exempt except for one in the City of Flushing, which is Main Street from Chamberlain to Pierson Road. That is going to be non-exempt but will not trigger a new Conformity Analysis and will be modeled when the next Conformity Analysis is conducted. The Interagency Work Group (IAWG) has reviewed the listing of projects for this amendment and has provided concurrence with staff's recommendations. At this time the Technical Advisory Committee is recommending approval of FY 2017-2020 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) Amendment #16 to the Genesee County Metropolitan Alliance. Discussion ensued.

Motion: Action: Approve, **moved by** David Cain, **supported by** Chris Gehringer, to approve the FY 2017-2020 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) Amendment #16 as presented.

Motion carried unanimously.

C. Call for FY 2022 Local Bridge Program Applications

Jacob Maurer stated that the Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT) has announced its FY 2022 Local Bridge Program Call for Projects. The budget is estimated to be at \$48 million and the number of applications from one local agency is limited to five. Applications are due May 1, 2019. Any questions can be directed to the MDOT Bridge Program Manager, Keith Cooper at 517-335-4526.

D. Community Infrastructure Fund – Category B

Jacob Maurer stated that through the Governor's Public Act 473 of 2018, the Transportation Economic Development Fund (TEDF) established a Category B Funding source. The act provides \$3 million per year through FY 2023. This is specifically for cities and villages with a population of 10,000 or fewer. This would be a maximum grant request of \$250,000 and would require a 50/50 match. Each community can submit up to five projects on one application. Discussion ensued.

E. 2019 Iron Belle Trail Grant Opportunity

Jacob Maurer advised that the deadline for this opportunity passed but staff got the agenda packet out to the committee before the deadline. This is for the communities located along Michigan's Iron Belle Trail route. The maximum request is up to \$50,000. One community, City of Grand Blanc, submitted an application.

F. Fixing Michigan Roads Plan – Summary

Jason Nordberg advised that staff just wanted the committee to be aware of this. There was a handout provided to the committee from the State Budget Office. In

Michigan, there is an Act 51 formula where funding is distributed. This new funding is proposing to bypass that formula. It is based upon how many cars drive down the road. In general, a lot of communities might miss out on getting their roads fixed. If this goes through, the public is going to think the roads are going to get fixed. If local communities ask for mileages, there might be a perception in the community that they are already paying enough money for roads. Staff suggests letting this mature a little bit more before proceeding with a formal response.

Bob Slattery stated that at the Michigan Municipal League board meeting the Governor's full proposal was endorsed. Mr. Slattery indicated there was no need for panic, and he encouraged everyone to feel free to pass comments on to the Governor's office. Discussion ensued.

A. 2019 Metropolitan Transportation Planning Certification Review for the Flint, Michigan Transportation Management Area (Genesee County Metropolitan Alliance)

Jason Nordberg stated that earlier today staff had a public meeting on the planning process. Aaron Dawson from Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) held a public meeting and staff appreciates those that came early and provided input to that. That kicks off the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Certification Review for Flint. This happens every four (4) years for the Federal Transportation Planning Process in Genesee County. For the next several days, FHWA and Federal Transit Administration (FTA) will be in the GCMPC office going through documents and asking questions, trying to see how the planning process is doing in Genesee County. The last certification was a clean certification with recommendations and commendations and no corrective actions.

Aaron Dawson, FHWA, stated that there is an opportunity for members from the TAC committee or this committee to come in and comment on the state of the planning process tomorrow from 11:00 to 12:00 in the GCMPC conference room.

Attached is the description of proposed projects in the FY 2017-2020 TIP Amendment # 17. This amendment deletes five (5) projects and adds ten (10) projects to the FY 2017-2020 TIP.

This amendment meets the financial constraints of the TIP and will have no disproportionately high or adverse impacts to any of the identified Environmental Justice (EJ) populations in Genesee County. The projects that are being amended are eligible for the funding programmed, and they meet the intended state (including State TEDF Category C) and federal goals and objectives identified for the funding.

Staff has reviewed these projects and has determined that all projects are exempt from Air Quality Conformity Analysis as consistent with Conformity Regulations. The Interagency Work Group (IAWG) has reviewed the listing of projects for this amendment and has provided concurrence with staff's determination.

SUBJECT: 2019 Trail Count Survey Requests

The Genesee County Metropolitan Planning Commission (GCMPC) is now accepting requests from all Genesee County municipalities who are interested in collecting pedestrian and bicyclists count statistics along their non-motorized trail network. Spring is here and staff is beginning to develop a schedule to collect non-motorized counts on trails throughout the county. Each count will have a duration of two weeks. Each survey will depict general usage trends such as daily average, busiest days, hourly profiles, and comparisons between weekday vs. weekend (see attached example).

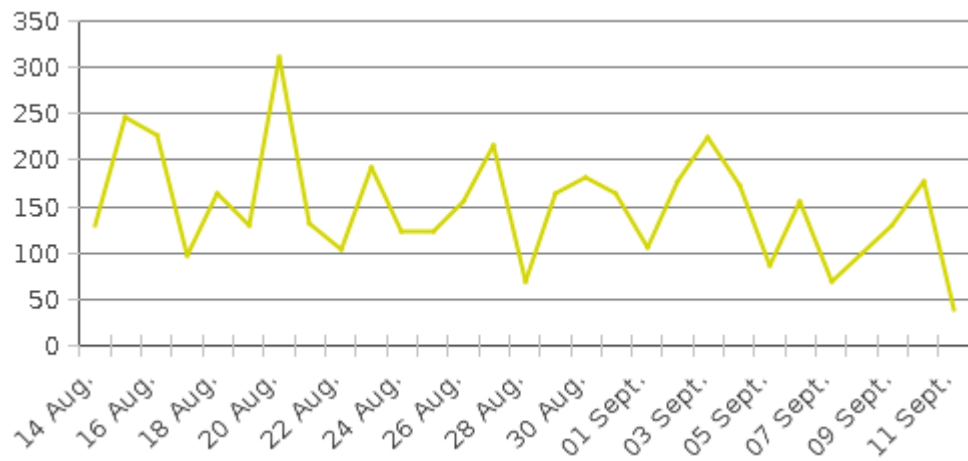

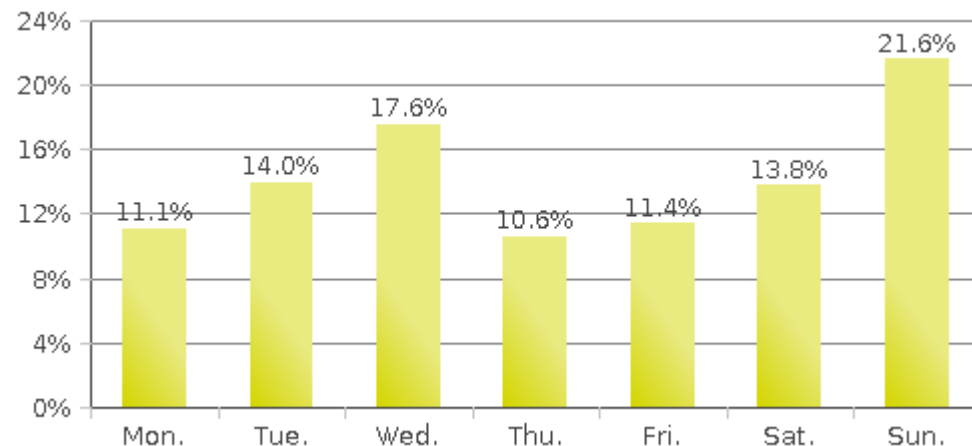
GCP - Bluegill Boat Launch

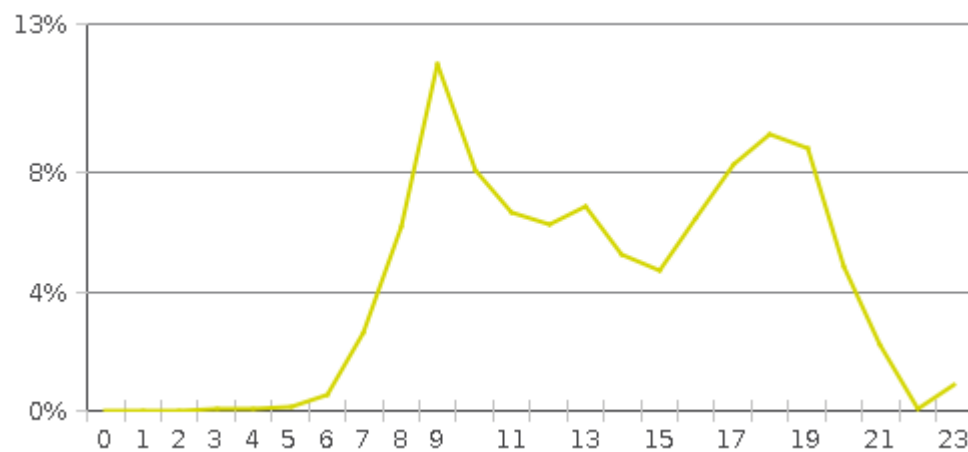

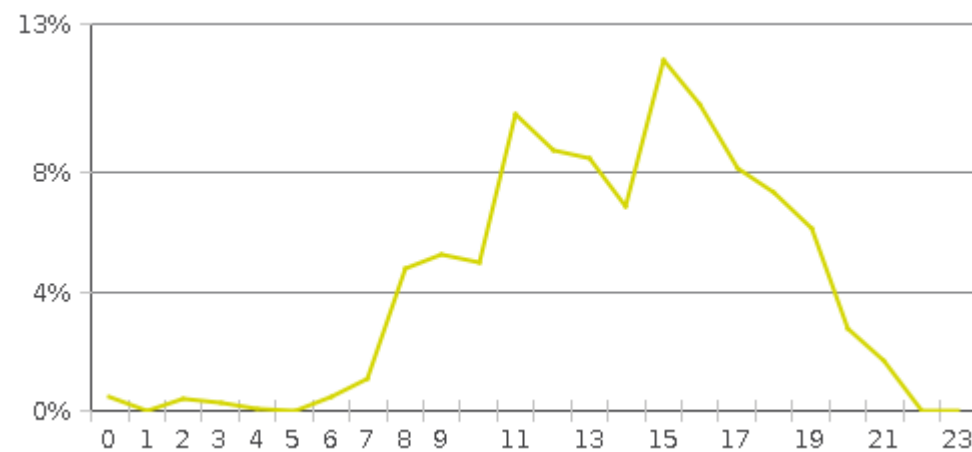
Weekly Profile

SUBJECT: **2019 Local Traffic Count Program**

Each year, staff requests local units of government in Genesee County to update traffic count information on federal-aid eligible roads under their jurisdiction. Traffic Counts are useful for a variety of county-wide planning activities, and are required on many federal-aid roads for the Highway Performance Monitoring System (HPMS). Staff will be sending out letters to each local road agency with a list of locations requiring 48-hour traffic counts for 2019. If there are additional locations your agency would like to count, you may send those to us as well.

As traffic counts are taken, remember to upload this information to the web-based traffic count system. If you are not participating in the web-based system, you may send traffic count data in Roadsoft or Excel formats via e-mail to ZSompels@co.genesee.mi.us. Optimal times for taking traffic counts are in the spring before schools are out for the summer and in the autumn after the Labor Day Holiday. Also, Tuesday through Thursday provide the best average weekday count.

GCMPC has traffic counters and accessory equipment available for rental by local agencies. The counters can collect vehicle counts, as well as other necessary traffic data. The charge for equipment rental is \$5.00 per day or \$25.00 per week, per counter. Our staff is available to assist in setup and training.

SUBJECT: **Interactive Visual Mapping of Regional Trails**

With the assistance of a consultant, staff will soon be developing 360-degree panoramic image maps of Genesee County's non-motorized land trails. This project will complement the I-69 Thumb Region's recreation website that included Genesee County non-motorized routes, set to launch this Spring. The interactive maps will also help GCMPC highlight the region's excellent amenities and the high quality of life that is available.

Project Scope:

Outside Ventures, LLC. (Terrain 360) will create a comprehensive visual guide of Genesee County's non-motorized trails (up to 100 miles) using 360-degree, surface-level image mapping. Other site-specific features will include geo-tagging, weather, and invasive species detection.

The trail mapping is expected to commence in May 2019. Processing and editing digital image files, interface design and launch for online applications will be completed by the end of June. Staff is finalizing the hiking and biking locations within Genesee County to capture (see attached). Please let us know if we have missed a location in your community.

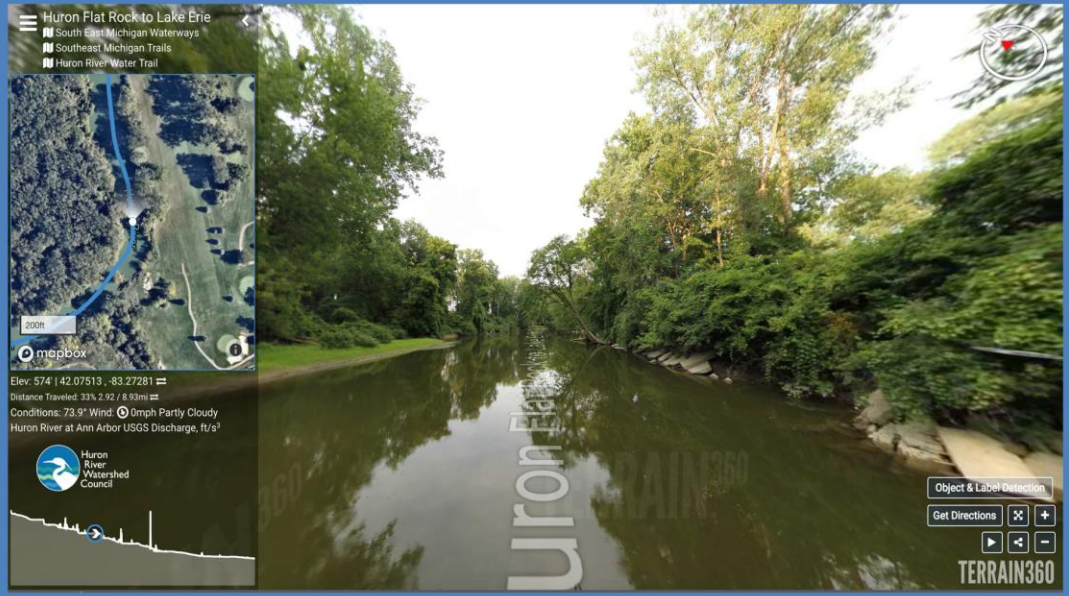

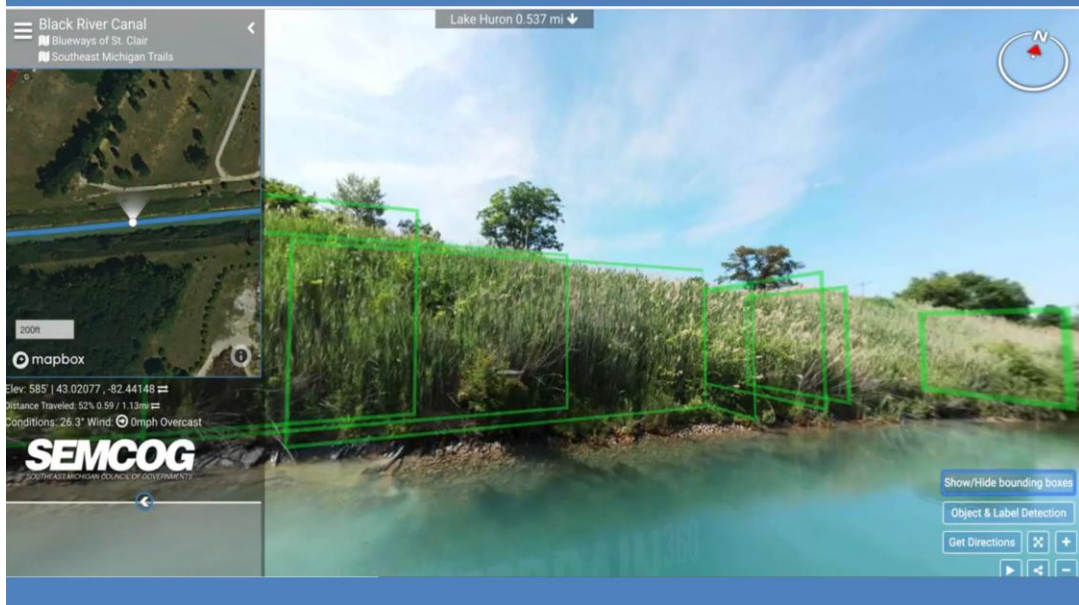
