X. OLD BUSINESS

*****A. FY 2024 Unified Work Program**

Mr. Jacob Maurer stated that the Draft FY 2024 Unified Work Program (UWP) was included in the agenda packet. The UWP outlines how staff will spend their time in the major programs in the next fiscal year. The major activities included in the UWP are the development of the 2050 Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP), managing the current Transportation Improvement Plan (TIP), working on a new Safety Action Plan, and continuing the US-23 Corridor Study. These activities are in addition to the many transportation related functions our staff provides on a daily basis. At this time, TAC is recommending approval of the FY 2024 UWP to the Genesee County Metropolitan Alliance through the attached resolution and to authorize Derek Bradshaw to sign all contracts and agreements related to the work program.

*****B. Pavement, Bridge, & System Reliability Performance Targets**

Ms. McKenna Dutkiewicz stated at the April METRO meeting, staff reviewed the performance targets for Pavement, Bridge, System Reliability, and Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality (CMAQ). Ms. Dutkiewicz reviewed the statewide targets through a small presentation, going over each performance area and measure, and included the baseline conditions, 2-year and 4-year targets for each. At this time, TAC recommends that METRO adopt MDOT's performance targets for Bridge, Pavement, System Reliability, and CMAQ by way of the attached resolution.

XI. NEW BUSINESS

*****A. FY 2023-2026 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) Amendment #8**

Ms. Dutkiewicz stated Amendment #8 changes three projects, and adds one project, to the FY 2023-2026 TIP. At this time, the Technical Advisory Committee is recommending the endorsement of Amendment #8 to the FY 2023-2026 TIP from the Genesee County Metropolitan Alliance.

*****B. FY 2025 List of Proposed Safety Projects**

Ms. Dutkiewicz stated that staff received 6 local safety project applications which were reviewed using the time-of-return analysis. At this time, the Technical Advisory Committee recommends that the Genesee County Metropolitan Alliance approves the prioritized list of FY 2025 Safety Projects for MDOT consideration by way of the attached resolution.

C. 2023 Non-Motorized Count Survey Requests

Ms. Dutkiewicz stated that staff is accepting requests from all Genesee County municipalities who are interested in collecting count statistics along non-motorized trail networks. If your community is interested in participating in the 2023 Non-Motorized Trail Count program, staff is available to discuss locations to install the counters along your trails. A Committee member asked if there is a charge to use the counters and Mr. Maurer stated there is no charge. He added that staff has been working with Local Units of Government for about 7 years with these counters and it has provided some very useful data which may help communities get grant dollars back into their area. Mr. Maurer stated that the counters can typically be installed from Spring through Fall and he gave a brief description of the simple installation process. Discussion ensued.

D. 2023 Local Traffic Count Program

Ms. Dutkiewicz stated that staff is requesting that local units of government update traffic count information on roads under their jurisdiction. GCMPC has traffic counters and accessory equipment available for rental by local units of government. The charge for the equipment rental is \$5.00 per day or \$25.00 per week per counter. Staff is available to assist with setup and training. Please remember to upload the information gathered to the web-based traffic count system.

E. Adjusted Census Urban Boundaries (ACUB) Establishment & Revision

Mr. Maurer stated that at previous METRO meetings, staff discussed the release of the 2020 Census Urban Boundary and how that may affect the boundaries in Genesee County as far as urbanized area. The next step is to start setting up meetings with road agencies to make adjustments to smooth out the boundaries to prevent switching back and forth between 2 different types of classifications in a short distance. The result of these meetings will be Adjusted Census Urban Boundaries (ACUB) which helps in determining the federal aid network of roads. GCMPC will then work with MDOT for further guidance on how this will impact transportation funding. Staff will keep this committee informed as more information is released.

XII. OTHER BUSINESS

A. Genesee County Road Commission Presentation

Mr. Alex Patsy of the Genesee County Road Commission gave the annual presentation of the 2023 Road Improvement Program in the County, speaking about Federally funded projects and Road Commission funded projects, which includes primary roads and bridges. Mr. Patsy also went over commercial and subdivision projects, local road resurfacing projects, local bridge preventative maintenance and culvert replacements. Discussion ensued.

XIII. ANNOUNCEMENTS

A. Genesee County Recycle Day(s)

Mr. Maurer stated that we have 8 scheduled Genesee County Recycle Days, 2 per month between the months of May and August. These events are very popular and you may register for an appointment to attend one of these events by visiting our website at gcmopc.org and signing up for an appointment.

Staff is currently working on a establishing a permanent recycling center along near I-475 and downtown Flint. This project is currently in the process of environmental reviews, permitting and getting bids on demolition of current buildings on site.

Amendment # 9**

Attached is the description of proposed projects in the FY 2023-2026 TIP Amendment # 9. This amendment abandons two (2) projects in the FY 2023-2026 TIP.

This amendment meets the financial constraints of the TIP and will have no disproportionately high or adverse impacts on any of the identified Environmental Justice (EJ) populations in Genesee County. The projects being amended are eligible for the funding programmed and meet the intended state (including State TEDF Category C) and federal goals and objectives identified for the funding.

The assumptions asserted in the conformity document for the FY 2023-2026 TIP, for which this amendment is being made, are maintained for transportation control measures (TCM), fiscal constraint, and public involvement. Thus, this amendment also meets the Clean Air Act and Transportation Conformity rules required for the 1997 ozone National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS).

At this time, the Technical Advisory Committee is recommending the approval of the attached Amendment #9 to the FY 2023-2026 Transportation Improvement Program by the Genesee County Metropolitan Alliance.
